## • TPM Overview

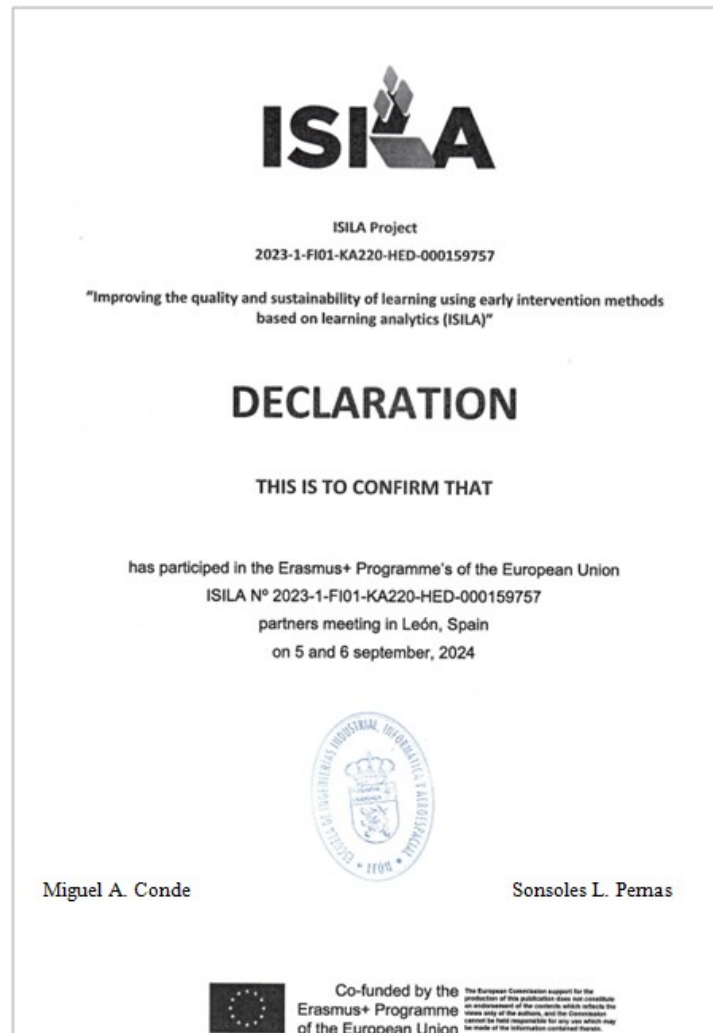

## • Evaluation

In general there were no significant negative comments.

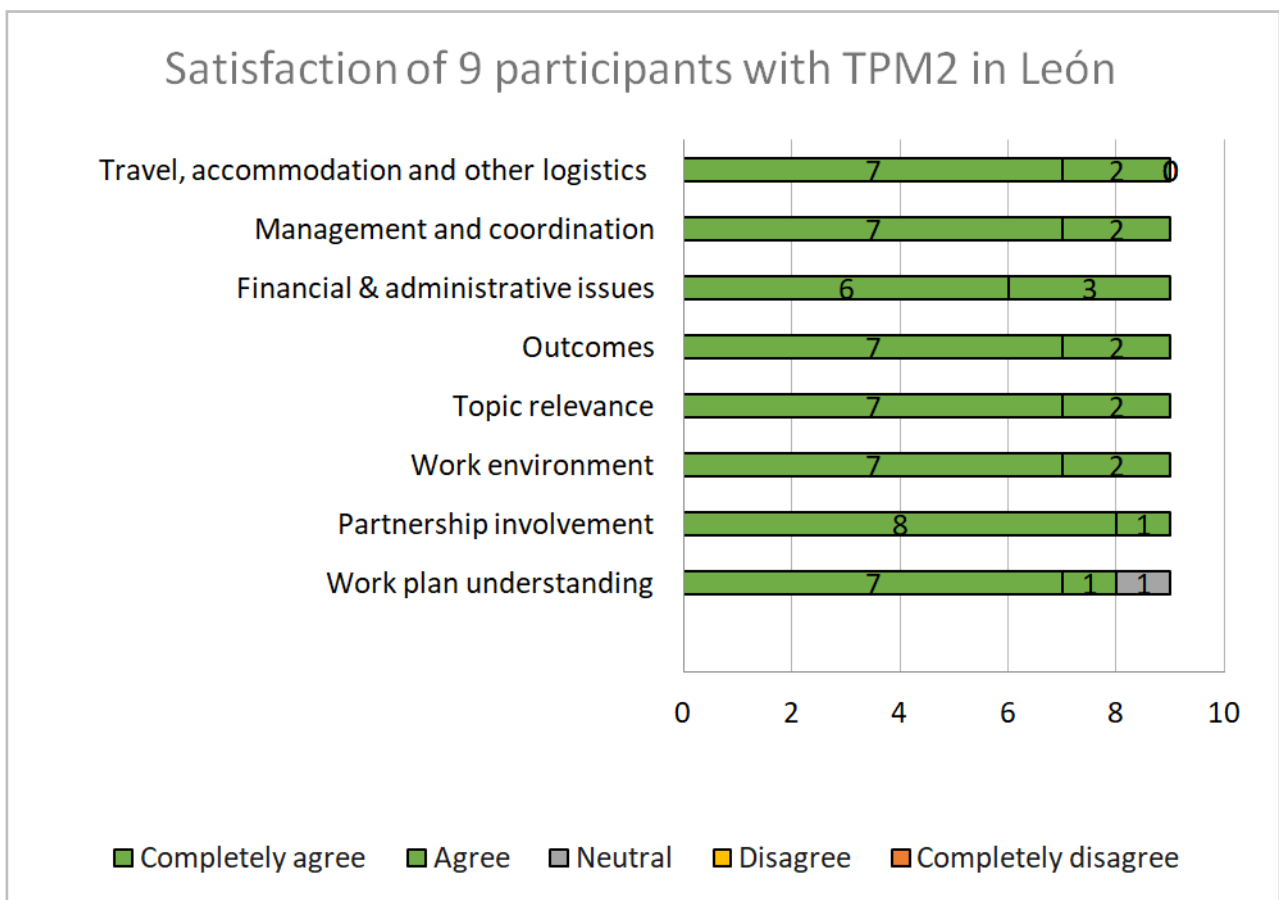


Figure 3: ISILA TPM Evaluation Results
